Psychology	The study of human mind

Curator	a person in charge of a museum.
Immigrant	one who settled in other country
Refugee	a person seeking protection in another country
Epicurean	pursuing pleasure, especially in reference to food or comfort
Recurrent	happening or recurring time after time
Chastise	to criticize someone severely
Scoff	to sneer or laugh with scorn
Purr	a low vibrating sound, usually made by a cat or a vehicle
Quorum	minimum people needed for a meeting
Obsolete	no longer of use
Invoice	Detail list of goods dispatched with quantity and price to the purchaser.

Magnificent	Extremely beautiful, elaborate or impressive
Pergola	an arch or a structure with a roof over which climbing plants can be grown.
Omnipotent	having virtually unlimited power or influence
Archives	the place where public, government or historical records are kept
Posthumous Publication	A book published after author's death
Diagnosis	the identification of an illness or other problem by examination of the symptoms
Mendicant	one who goes from palace to place, begging
Limelight	center of public attention
Glutton	A person who eats to much
