Hearse	the vehicle which carries dead bodies
Directory	A book where name and addresses of people living in area is kept
Ambivert	A person who has features of extrovert and introvert
Orthopedic	related to treatment of bone problems
Invincible	something which cannot be easily conquered.
Bibliophile	A person who loves and collects books.
Conformist	A person who conforms to accepted behavior or established practices.
Franchise	the right to vote in an election, especially in order to elect a parliament or similar law-making organization
Monk	A person who lives secluded or solitary life, often for religious reasons
Numismatics	A study of coins/collection of coins
Squabble	Argue loudly about unimportant things
Epic	a long poem telling of the deeds of a hero and often centering on the ideals of a nation or culture.
Kin	one's relatives or family, related
Cacographer	One who has bad handwriting or is bad at spellings
Involuntary	done without conscious control; unintentional
Invoke	to request aid, usually from a deity
Plutocracy	a political system governed by the wealthy
Oligarchy	a territory or group that is controlled by only a few individuals
Ambience	The character and atmosphere of a place

Cartography	the science of producing maps
Ingenious	Exceptionally clever or talented
Philanthropist	A lover of mankind
Narcissist	obsessed with one's importance and/or physical appearance.
Dermatology	The study of skin
Congenital	existing since birth
Dexterous	Showing or having skill, especially with the hand
Insomniac	a person who is regularly unable to sleep
Bohemian	an unconventional style of living
Livestock	Animals especially on a farm, regarded as an asset.
Stricken	Affected by undesirable condition or unpleasant feeling
Jurisprudence	The theory of philosophy of law
Pacifism	the belief that any violence are unjustifiable, and that it should never be used
Regalia	special clothes and decorations, used at official ceremonies or occasions
Ornament	a decoration added onto something else to make it more beautiful
Virtuoso (n)	One who possesses outstanding technical ability in a particular art or field
Virtuous(adj)	behaving in a morally good way
Alimony	The allowance which is paid to wife on legal separation
Racism	prejudice and discriminatory actions towards others because of their ethnicity
Anagram	a word or phrase made by using the letters of another word or phrase in a different order

Shoal	A group of fish swimming together
Fatalist	one who believes in fate,
Aristocracy	A form of government in which power is held by the nobility
Fundraiser	an organisation that raises money for a particular cause
Lump Sum	an amount of money that is paid at one time
Ambidextrous	Able to use both his left and right hands equally well
Theology	The study of religion
Regicide	The murder of a king

Extempore	a speech made without preparation
