Edible	Fit to be eaten.
Anarchist	A person who believes that law and governments are not necessary
Apostate	a person who renounces a religious or political belief or principle.
Misanthrope	A person who hates and avoids other people
Mint	A place where coins, medals, or tokens are made.
Encyclopedia	A book that contains information on various subjects.
Atheist	One who doesn't believe in God .
Bonfire	a large fire that is made outside to burn unwanted things, or for pleasure.
Casino	A place for gambling.
Monotonous	Never changing and therefore boring.
Mammal	any animal in which the female gives birth to babies, not eggs, and feeds them on milk from her own body.
Alimony	The money paid to the former wife, husband, or partner when the marriage is ended.
Caravan	a group of travelers, animals, or vehicles traveling together
Saga	- a long story about past events over a long period of time.
Lexicographer	A person who compiles a dictionary.
Shoal	A large number of fish swimming together.
Nostalgia	a feeling of pleasure and also slight sadness when you think about things that happened in the past:
Conspiracy	A secret plan, made to do something (usually wrong)

Procrastinate	To put off doing something, especially out of habitual carelessness or laziness.
Samaritan	A person who gives help and sympathy to people who need it
Fastidious	one who is hard to please.
Cartographer	someone who makes or draws map
Amphibian	Animal that lives both on land and water.
Relic	Something belonging to or surviving from an earlier period.
Anthropology	The study of evolution of mankind.
Firm	not soft but not completely hard.
Orphan	One who has lost one's parents.
Plutocracy	Government governed by wealth.
Plagiarism	Copying someone else's work and trying to submit it as your own
Daredevil	A person who enjoys doing dangerous things, in a way that other people may think is stupid.
Waif	Forsaken or neglected child who has no home and spends most of his/her time on the streets.
Convalescence	Gradual recovery of health and strength.
Aviary	A place where birds are kept.
Ductile	capable of being bent or pulled into different shapes.
Pessimist	One who looks at the negative side of everything.
Vacillate	Waver between different opinions or actions

Imposter	One who pretends to be somebody else.
Assassin	A person who kills somebody, especially for political reasons.
Congregation	A group of worshippers.
Domicile	The place that a person treats as his permanent home, or lives in and has a substantial connection with.
Granary	A storehouse for threshed grain.
Slouch	to stand, sit, or walk with the shoulders hanging forward and the head bent slightly over so that you look tired and bored:
Deaf	One who cannot hear.
Malevolent	Causing or wanting to cause harm or evil to someone.
Fatal	- Causing or ending in death.
Fatalist	One who believes in fate.
Pact	A formal agreement between two or more nations or persons.
Septuagenarian	A person whose age is between 70 and 79 years.
Adventurous	Willing to take risks and try new ideas.
Shuttle	A shuttle is a plane, bus, or train which makes frequent journeys between two places.
Philanthropist	One who loves mankind.
Bark	Outer protective layer of a tree.
Lexicography	The practice of writing dictionaries.
Decoding	Changing secret and coded messages in a readable form.

Snug	(of a person) feeling warm, comfortable, and protected, or (of a place, especially a small place) giving feelings of warmth, comfort, and protection
Magnanimous	kind, generous and forgiving (especially towards an enemy or a competitor that you have beaten)
Invincible	that can not be defeated or changed.
Illegible	Which cannot be read
Autobiography	Life history written by oneself.
Genocide	The murder of a large number of people from a particular nation or ethnic group.
Wreath	an arrangement of flowers and leaves in a circular shape, used as a decoration or as a sign of respect and remembrance for a person who has died.
Teetotaler	one who does not drink alcohol
Hangar	a place where aircraft are kept when not in use.
Cemetery	a graveyard where dead bodies are buried.
Cosmopolitan	Someone who regards the world as his country.
Oblivious	Not informed about or aware of something
Hysterical	unable to control your feelings or behaviour because you are extremely frightened, angry, excited, etc.
