Drove	a large number of people or animals, often moving or doing something as a group
Trilogy	a group of three novels, plays, etc. that form a set
Autonomy	the quality or state of being self-governing
Astronaut	A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft
Eavesdropper	a person who listens to someone's private conversation without them knowing:
Infirmary	A place in a large institution, for the care of those who are ill
Numerologist	One who studies the occult meanings of numbers and their supposed influence on human life
Infinite	an amount that is so endless it's impossible to calculate
Fortuitous	something that is to your advantage but happened by chance:
Disrupt	interrupt (an event, activity, or process) by causing a disturbance or problem.
Somniloquy	The act or habit of talking in one's sleep
Bouquet	a creative arrangement of flowers
Arbitrator	A person appointed by two parties to solve a dispute
Mortality	The state of being subject to death
Medley	a collection of songs or other musical items performed as a continuous piece
Cypher/Cipher	A secret or disguised way of writing
Cacophony	an unpleasant mixture of loud sounds

Brood	a group of young birds all born at the same time:
Siesta	A short rest or sleep taken after lunch
Conglomerate	a big corporation composed of several small firms that operate as a single business
Anchor	A person who presents a radio/television programme
Escort	to go with someone or something as a companion or guard
Rhetoric	The art of effective or persuasive speaking or writing
Creche	A nursery where children of working parents are cared for while their parents are at work
Troop	soldiers on duty in a large group:
Prophet	a person who speaks for God, or someone who can predict what will happen in the future
Mutiny	an organized revolt against those in power
Cynic	a person who believes that humans are only motivated by selfishness and their own interests
Outdo	Be more successful than someone
Agony	extreme mental or physical suffering
Rapture	a mood of great joy or love
Turncoat	a traitor who sides with the conflicting side
Invader	an army or country that uses force to enter and take control of another country:
Namesake	a person having the same name as another.
Ancestors	a person related to you who lived a long time ago

Ecology	study of environment
Valetudinarian	a person who is unduly anxious about his/her health
Dormitory	A large bedroom for a number of people in a school or institution.
Eclipse	when the light of the Sun or Moon is blocked
Stellar	pertaining to the stars
Solstice	the time when the sun is furthest north or south of Earth's equator
Notorious	a person of Evil reputation
Patrol	to go around an area to keep a watch

Honorary	one who hold a post without salary,
Freelance	working for different companies at different times, as opposed to being employed by one company
Souvenir	an item of sentimental value, to remember an event or location
Impromptu	done or said without earlier planning or preparation:
Jaywalk	to cross streets on foot carelessly
Winnow	to separate Husk from the green
