Faction	a group within a larger group
Inarticulate	unable to express feelings clearly
Demography	the study of human inhabitants and how their populations vary over time
Anonymous	bearing no name, With secret identity
Antidote	A remedy to counteract the effects of poison
Plenitude	full , complete or abundance of something
Benefactor	someone who helps another person, group, etc by giving money
Quash	to officially put an end to something
Lurch`	to make a sudden, unsteady movement forward or to one side
Heuristic	enabling someone to learn something by themselves
Polemics	the practice or skill of arguing strongly for or against something/somebody
Contemporary	someone living during the same period as someone else
Versatile	having the ability to do a number/variety of things well
Wrangle	an argument that is complicated and continues over a long period of time
Ardour	feelings of great intensity and warmth, eagerness; zeal
Mercenary	a soldier who will fight for any country or group that offers payment
Acoustics	Mercy+Na – money dene pe no mercy
Acoustics	The scientific study of sound, the qualities or characteristics of a room, auditorium, stadium

Altruism	selflessness and humanity towards others
Bankrupt	unable to pay his debts
Abattoir	a place where animals are slaughtered for the market
Revamp	to renovate or improve
Plagiarise	to copy another person's ideas, words or work and pretend that they are your own`
Epitaph	the words inscribed on the tomb in the memory of the person
Irascible	easily provoked to anger; very irritable
Stalwart	extremely dedicated and loyal supporter who does a lot of work for an organization, especially a political party
Haul	to pull something/somebody with a lot of effort
Outlandish	looking or sounding foreign, bizarre, strange, unfamiliar
Celibacy	the state of not being married and never having sex, especially for religious reasons
Seismograph	an equipment that measures and records the strength of an earthquake
Relapse	to become ill or start behaving badly again, after making an improvement
Obituary	an article about somebody's life and achievements, that is printed in a newspaper soon after they have died
Interlude	a period of time between two events during which something different happens
Cluster	a group of similar things that are physically close to one another

Epitome	a perfect example of something
Amble	to walk at a slow relaxed speed
Romp	to play in an excited and energetic way
Inaudible	- that you cannot hear

Punctilious	showing great attention to detail or correct behavior
Introspection	the process of examining one's own thoughts and feelings
