<b>Weary</b>	Feeling or showing extreme tiredness
<b>Ominous</b>	Giving the worrying impression that something bad is going to happen
<b>Graft</b>	A piece of a living tissue or plant that is transplanted surgically
<b>Rectify</b>	Adjust or make right; correct, amend
<b>Equinox</b>	equal day and night / either of the two occasions in the year when the centre of the sun is directly above the Equator, and day and night are approximately equal in length
<b>Flora</b>	the plants of a particular region
<b>Abridgement</b>	A shortened version of a larger work
<b>Invigilator</b>	a person whose job is to watch people taking an exam in order to check that they do not cheat
<b>Clamour</b>	A loud appeal or demand
<b>Philology</b>	The study of languages
<b>Acerbic</b>	Sharp and direct
<b>Constellation</b>	Series of stars
<b>Amateur</b>	a person who takes part in an activity for pleasure, not as a job
<b>Negotiator</b>	One who mediates in a deal or complex situation
<b>Mausoleum</b>	A very expensive and elaborately built tomb
<b>Nostalgia</b>	An excessively intense desire for returning to past or lost conditions
<b>Matricide</b>	The act of killing one's mother
<b>Ablutions</b>	The act of washing oneself
<b>Legacy</b>	the long-lasting impact of particular events, actions, etc. that took place in the past, or of a person's life.
<b>Legacy</b>	an amount of money or property left to someone in a will.

<b>Islet</b>	A small island
<b>Hangar</b>	A large building with an extensive floor area, typically for housing aircraft
<b>Kennel</b>	A small shelter for a dog
<b>Aborigines</b>	a person, animal, or plant that has been in a country or region from earliest times
<b>Tenacious</b>	Holding on to something or keeping an opinion with determination
<b>Absolution</b>	Formal forgiveness of a person's sins
<b>Hyperbole</b>	An exaggerated statement not to be taken seriously or literally
<b>Overlook</b>	Fail to notice; ignore; condone (an offence etc.)
<b>Mortuary</b>	A room where dead bodies are kept until burial
<b>Defamation</b>	The action of damaging the good reputation of someone
<b>Animosity</b>	a strong feeling of opposition , anger or hatred
<b>Infanticide</b>	Murder of an infant
<b>Sanguinary</b>	A battle or anything involving or causing much bloodshed
<b>Credible</b>	Able to be believed or trusted
<b>FUGITIVE</b>	Someone who flees from prison and custody someone who is sought by law officer
<b>Alliteration</b>	Words that begin with the same letter, syllable or sound
<b>Remorse</b>	Having a feeling of guilt
<b>Iconoclast</b>	One who is breaker of images and tradition
<b>Gourmet</b>	Who loves good food and knows a lot about it
<b>Bilingual</b>	Able to use two languages equally well
<b>Surrender</b>	To give up completely or agree to forgo, especially in favour of another

<b>Feasible</b>	Something that is capable of being accomplished
<b>Botany</b>	The scientific study of plants and their structure
<b>Exit poll</b>	A poll taken of voters leaving the voting place that is usually used for predicting the winners

<b>Testimonial</b>	A formal statement testifying to someone's character and qualifications
<b>Tiny</b>	Something that is very small/little
